Wednesdays from 11:00 – 11:30 am at City Hall Council Chambers

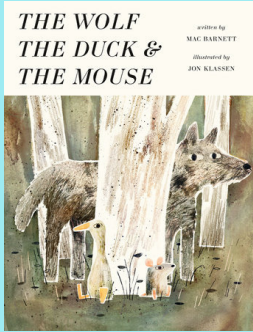

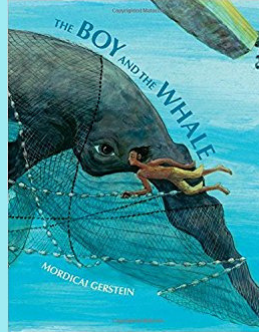
Books We Recommend: Animals!

The Blue Whale by Jenni Desmond

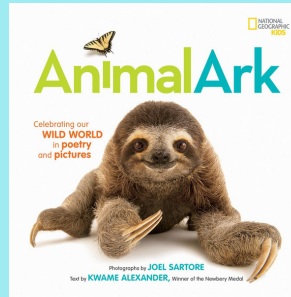
This charming book full of playfully illustrated comparisons and observations includes many jaw-dropping facts about the largest creature on earth.

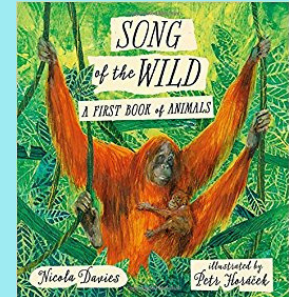
Bugs From Head to Tail by Stacey Roderick

Animal Ark by Kwame Alexander

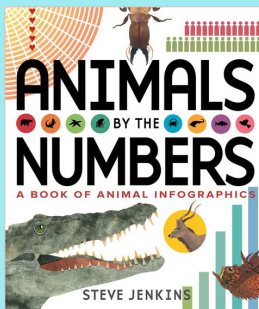
Filled with striking photos and poetic words, this Newbery medalist takes us on a journey and asks us to consider our actions in relation to wildlife.



Song of the Wild: A First Book of Animals by Nicola Davies

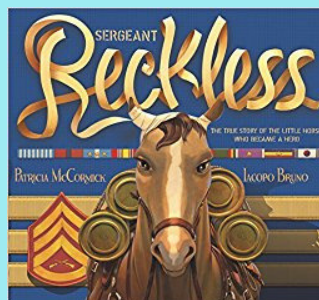
A remarkable combination of outstanding illustrations and beautiful poetry make this book a treasure.

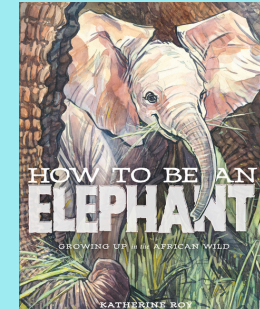
Animals By The Numbers by Steve Jenkins
