

SUBJECT: Accept Bid on Surplus Radio System

The City Council at the April 19, 1982, City Council meeting accepted my recommendation to establish the low frequency radio system as surplus equipment and advertise the equipment for bids.

Only one bid was received from G.L. Forrette for a total cost of \$1500.00 for the base station and 6 mobile radios. The system is presently $2\frac{1}{2}$ years old and the resale value does not stay relatively high for used systems. The original base station was approximately \$1,100.00 with each mobile radio about \$500.00.

The City needs a more adaptable radio system of which the high frequency system would allow, and would put the City's facilities on a 24 hour watch due to the direct intertie with the T.R.F.P.D.

Recommendation

- 1. Accept the bid for the low frequency surplus radio system by G.L. Forrette for a total cost of \$1500.00.
- 2. The low frequency system will not be sold to Mr. Forrette until the City purchases and installs the new high frequency system approved during the Supplemental Budget.
